Many of us are in the process of certifying our aircraft for the new Sport Plane rule "ELSA" or the old amateur built experimental rule. The FAA requires that a "Major Portion" of the aircraft must be completed by the builder(s). Definition from AC 20-27F, Major Portion: When the aircraft is completed, the majority of the fabrication and assembly TASKS have been performed by the amateur builder. When you purchase a partially completed kit or aircraft, the major portion INCLUDES the construction efforts of the previous amateur builders.

The treasurer's report, in which there was the mention of eight membership renewals, was read aloud by Mr. Bill Shippee, our treasurer, and accepted as read, motioned and seconded.

THE '07 EVENT COMMITTEE: As reported by Mr. Chip Diggins, a per head cost of \$15 will be assessed by a Rhode Island firm for a Pig Roast which the club would like to have the last weekend before the Labor Day weekend. In order to make a profit and to include a beverage to the customer, it was suggested by Chip to charge \$18 per ticket to the customers.

Mr. Diggins told the group the firm wants the money up front in order to deliver on the order.....therefore, we will have to sell tickets in advance for this event in order to pay the vendor.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 PM.

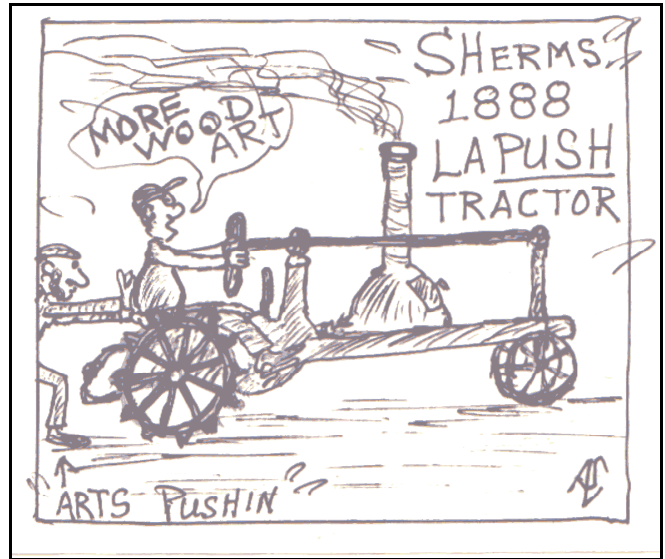
